the potential of your gift

Loved ones are the first thing we think about in the morning and the last thing we think about at night. Writing your Will is no different. Adding a small percentage or amount to Worldwide Cancer Research allows you to take care of your loved ones first, last and always by ending the suffering caused by cancer for future generations.

Did you know? Worldwide Cancer Research receives no government funding. This means that every penny spent on life-saving discovery research comes from generous supporters.

£225,000

funds an entire research project for three years – this bold idea could unlock new ways to prevent, diagnose and treat cancer.

£50,000

taps into the expertise of the scientists required to work on a research project for an entire year.

£30,000

fuels a research project for five months, allowing the brightest researchers to make discoveries that could save the lives of the people you love.

£15,000

funds a year's worth of lab gear – the essential tools needed to kick-start life-saving cancer research.

£5,000

pays for a year's worth of equipment needed by our team of pioneers to grow millions of cancer cells in the lab to test out new ways to treat the disease.

£250

funds more than a day's worth of bold, discovery research led by scientists all over the world.

types of gifts

Gifts in Wills may come in different shapes and sizes, but gifts in Wills to Worldwide Cancer Research come together to kick-start life-saving cancer cures.

- ♥ Some people choose to leave a percentage or share of their estate, which means a share of your total possessions. This is called a residuary gift.
- ♥ Others choose to give a lump sum. This is a fixed amount of money such as £250, £2,500, £25,000. This is called a pecuniary gift.
- ♥ For some, valuable items including antiques and jewellery. This is known as a specific gift.

Whichever way you choose to leave a gift in your Will, we promise to use it to fund as much life-saving discovery research as we possibly can.

Did you know? There are also financial benefits to leaving a gift in your Will to charity – they can reduce your inheritance tax.

If you don't already have a Will, our practical pointers will help you get started.

one Work out what you own and what you owe

Start by jotting down a list of your assets and their estimated value. Assets like property, shares, savings, and other items of value that you own, including jewellery, cars and antiques.

Next, consider what you owe. This may include your mortgage, loans or bills. Take what you owe away from your assets and this will give you an idea of the value of your estate.

two Decide who you'd like to benefit

Think about the family and friends you may wish to remember in your Will, before considering the causes you care about. Then decide how you'd like to divide your estate.

Choose executors

Most people choose trusted family members, friends or their solicitor to be their executor, and ensure that their wishes are carried out.

Meet a solicitor

We offer a free Will writing and review service. This allows you to easily write or update a simple Will – and it won't cost you a penny.

You don't have to include a gift to Worldwide Cancer Research, but of course we'd be extremely grateful if you did.

How does our Free Will Service work?

- ♥ This service is available on a first-come, first-served basis. If you're interested in finding out more, get in touch with us.
- ♥ Our partner, the National Free Wills Network, will then send you a list of your closest solicitors.
- ♥ You then decide which solicitor you'd prefer, and make an appointment.
- ♥ The solicitor draws up your Will, and so long as it's a simple Will, we'll cover the bill.
